Forgive us and reconnect us to your vine.


We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Saviour.

John 15: 1-8 The vine and the branches

15 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

⁵ 'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. Abiding in Jesus and producing fruit - John 15: 1-8

In another of the great 'I am' sayings, Jesus again transforms an image from the Old Testament. In the prophets, the vine represents Israel, usually in a context where the nation stands under judgement for her faithlessness. Now Jesus proclaims himself as the true Israel – the Vine. Those who remain in him, part of his community, will be protected from such faithlessness and its accompanying desolation. The word 'remain or abide' helpfully conveys a sense of both 'stay' and 'be with'.

What does Jesus mean by talking of our 'remaining or abiding' in each other? This will happen when we as believers receive and keep his words, which he in turn has received from the Father. But Jesus is talking of much more than mere obedience. The metaphor of the vine is marvellously reworked: God is no longer external, the one who plants something separate from him. Now, the branches are seen to draw their very life and fruitfulness from him.

The branches refer to us. Jesus is the vine and we are the branches. A branch cannot float around and exist by itself – it will have no effect and wither and die. In other words we need to abide in Jesus and not do our own thing and ask God to bless it.

The force of this passage is if you are going to follow Jesus, then follow Jesus! Don't be half-hearted about it. Remain in Jesus and produce fruit. We might need a bit of cleansing and we might need to work at it but we get there through worship, repentence (i.e. pruning or cleansing), receiving forgiveness, hearing the Word and applying it, and prayer. It's a process and we need to take these measures to keep ourselves abiding with Jesus. To hear the words of Jesus is to be filled with life, with the capacity to love, and with joy.

Remain as branches attached to this true vine, however, and 'ask whatever you wish, and it shall be done for you' (v.7). But what you wish cannot mean anything you desire, but only what is consistent with abiding in Jesus, the only source of a fruitful God-pleasing life.

Prayers of intercession

Risen Lord Jesus, hear our prayers for all who mourn as they remember loved ones lost to this pandemic. Hear our prayers for livelihoods destroyed and hopes devastated. Hear our prayers for all continuing to sustain and support us even as we begin to taste again so much we have had to wait for. Bless the nations with a renewing spirit of generosity, that vaccine and support might reach the poorest and most marginalised. We pray in your name.
